These estimates are based on the inspection and treatment plans as summarized in the report "Wood Pole Line Management Program, Executive Summary Report" contained in Section H of the Application. The report states the number of poles planned to be inspected in each year. The refurbishment estimates are based on the IOWA Curve expectation of how many poles will be rejected from these inspections. Following the engineering analysis of the inspection data, the scope of refurbishments may change but based on experience to date the variance is expected to be within 10% of the estimate.
