- Q. On page 2 of Corporate Overview Evidence it states that gross operating expenses have been reduced by approximately 22 percent since 1992. Please provide a comparable summary of gross operating expenses for 1992 and for 2001.
- A. Table 1 below shows a comparison of gross operating expenses for 1992, 2001 and 2002. Mr. Hughes' statement referred to the 22 per cent reduction in gross operating expenses from 1992 to forecast 2002. The reduction in reference to actual 2002 gross operating expenses is 23.3 per cent.
