Dear Minister Stoodley:

RE: Petroleum Products Pricing Review – Proposed Work Plan

This is in reply to your letter of June 7, 2022 in which you requested, pursuant to subsection 8.1(3) of the **Petroleum Products Act**, that the Board review the following matters:

- i. the suitability of the pricing mechanism for benchmark prices; and
- ii. the maximum markup between the wholesale price to the retailer and the retail price to the consumer for all regulated fuels (both of which comprise the total allowed markup).

You also directed the Board, pursuant to subsection 8.1(5) of the **Petroleum Products Act** to hold a hearing as part of this review to enable direct public input from residents throughout Newfoundland and Labrador into the review, through both in-person and written and electronic correspondence.

The proposed work plan attached sets out the activities to be completed as part of the Board's review as well as the associated timelines. This work plan was developed in consultation with Kalibrate Canada Inc. ("Kalibrate"), the consultant selected to assist the Board in its review. The work plan reflects Kalibrate's input as to the timelines required for its work as well as the Board's experience in the three previous major reviews of petroleum products pricing which all took approximately two years to complete.

It is noted that the schedule is largely driven by the time required by Kalibrate to complete its data collection, analysis and reports. To allow completion of some parts of the review while this work is ongoing, the work plan has been broken down into three phases, with the first reports and opportunity for public input scheduled for this fall.

As a part of its review the Board will provide several opportunities for consumer and industry participation and input, in writing as well as in-person. The information which is gathered during the review will be posted on the Petroleum Products Pricing Review page which will be created on the Board's website. Based on experience in previous reviews, it is expected that much of this information will be provided on a confidential basis and therefore will be presented in aggregate format.

We are available to you and/or your department officials to provide additional information or clarification on the proposed work plan prior to its finalization.
