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WHEREAS on May 14, 2020 Highlands Fuel Delivery G.P., dba Irving Energy ("Irving Energy") wrote the Board requesting an immediate review of the current maximum price for home heat propane and an immediate increase in the current maximum regulated price of propane in Zone 1 - Avalon Peninsula, pursuant to section 15(2)(a)(i) of the Regulations under the *Petroleum Products Act*; and

WHEREAS according to Irving Energy transportation costs for propane have increased as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic and the suspension of operations at the North Atlantic Refinery as of March 29, 2020; and

WHEREAS Irving Energy advised that, as a result of the suspension of operations at the North Atlantic Refinery, it has been required to ship propane by transport truck from Saint John, New Brunswick and Dartmouth, Nova Scotia since April 1, 2020, resulting in an increase in its costs which is not reflected in current maximum propane prices, and which will continue until the propane market context changes in Newfoundland; and

WHEREAS on May 28, 2020 the Board wrote Irving Energy advising of the specific costing and other information that would need to be provided to support its request; and

- WHEREAS on July 24, 2020 Irving Energy provided to the Board, on a confidential basis, the requested information to support its request for an increase in the maximum price of propane used for heating in Zone 1ANE - Avalon Peninsula Northeast, Zone 1ANW - Avalon Peninsula
- 35 Northwest and Zone 1AS Avalon Peninsula South; and

WHEREAS based on its review of the additional information provided the Board has determined that the incremental costs to Irving Energy associated with the alternate method of supply of propane for heating purposes to Zone 1ANE - Avalon Peninsula Northeast, Zone 1ANW - Avalon Peninsula Northwest and Zone 1AS - Avalon Peninsula South is 9.77 cents per litre; and

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WHEREAS the Board is satisfied that it is appropriate to adjust, on an interim basis, the total allowed mark-up for Irving Energy in Zone 1ANE - Avalon Peninsula Northeast, Zone 1ANW -Avalon Peninsula Northwest and Zone 1AS - Avalon Peninsula South for propane used for heating purposes by 9.77 cents per litre and that this increased total allowed markup for Irving Energy be used to set weekly maximum prices for Irving Energy in these zones until such time as supply resumes from the North Atlantic Refinery or some other alternate supply is established.

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IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:

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18 19 1. The total allowed mark-up for regulated propane for Irving Energy in Zone 1ANE - Avalon Peninsula Northeast, Zone 1ANW - Avalon Peninsula Northwest and Zone 1AS - Avalon Peninsula South will increase by 9.77 cents per litre effective 12:01 a.m. on Thursday, August 20, 2020, on an interim basis, until a further Order of the Board.

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2. Irving Energy shall provide to the Board by the 1st of each month, commencing on September 1, 2020, an update on the circumstances related to the supply of regulated propane by Irving Energy to Zone 1ANE - Avalon Peninsula Northeast, Zone 1ANW - Avalon Peninsula Northwest and Zone 1AS - Avalon Peninsula South, setting out any changes to the method of supply and the associated costs.
