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33	WHEREAS Aliant Telecom Incorporated (the "Customer") requested the Applicant to		
34	supply single-phase electrical service to Southwest Brook Microwave Communications Towe		
35	located on Route 432, approximately 17 km southwest of St. Julien's Intersection; and		
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1	WHEREAS the Customer has requested that the Applicant provide single-phase electrical	
2	service which, in order to so provide, requires the extension of approximately seventeen thousand	
3	(17,000) metres of single-phase distribution line to serve an expected demand between 10 kW ar	
4	350 kVA; and	
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6	WHEREAS Clause 5(b) of the CIAC Policy: Distribution Line Extensions and Upgrades to	
7	General Service Customers, approved by Order No. P.U. 7 (1997-98) dated September 30, 1997 (the	
8	"Policy"), requires the Applicant to calculate CIACs for General Service Customers with a demand	
9	between 10 kW and 350 kVA by the applicable Cost per Metre; and	
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11	WHEREAS the Applicant has applied for approval of a CIAC that deviates from the Policy	
12	in that it is using the detailed method for CIAC calculation using the "estimated construction costs"	
13	as set out in Clause 5(c) instead of the method set out in Clause 5(b) that uses the approved "Co	
14	per Metre" values; and	
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16	WHEREAS Clause 11(b) of the Policy states that the Applicant shall apply to the Board for	
17	approval of any deviations from the Policy in the calculation of CIACs for Line Extensions; and	
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19	WHEREAS the Applicant has calculated a total CIAC for the Line Extension in accordance	
20	with Clause 5(c) of the Policy, which calculation assumes the Line Extension will supply service to	
21	one (1) general service customer and the total CIAC thus calculated is nine hundred and eight	
22	thousand four hundred thirty-eight dollars (\$908,438.00), including HST; and	
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WHEREAS the total estimated construction cost of the Line Extension is \$908,438.00 and Clause 11(a) of the Policy states that all Line Extensions or Upgrades involving CIACs where the construction costs are estimated to be greater than \$25,000 must be submitted to the Board for approval; and

WHEREAS the proposed expenditures on the Line Extension are necessary for the Applicant to provide service and facilities to the Customer which are reasonably safe and adequate and just and reasonable as required pursuant to section 37 of the *Act*; and

WHEREAS the proposed CIAC is necessary to ensure that the Applicant's investment in the Line Extension is compensatory over the useful life of the Line Extension and will not be to the detriment of the Applicant's other customers.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:

Pursuant to section 41(5) of the *Act*, the Board approves the contribution in aid of construction in the amount of nine hundred and eight thousand, four hundred and thirty-eight dollars (\$908,438.00), including HST, for the supply of single-phase electrical service to one (1) general service customer, Aliant Telecom Incorporated's Southwest Brook Microwave Communications Tower, located on Route 432 approximately 17 km southwest of St. Julien's Intersection, as calculated under the Policy.
