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27	WHEREAS the Applicant is a corporation duly organized and existing under the laws of
28	the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador, is a public utility within the meaning of the Act, and is
29	subject to the provisions of the Electrical Power Control Act, 1994; and
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31	WHEREAS on behalf of the Town of Trout River (the "Customer"), EDM Consultants
32	Limited has requested the Applicant to supply three-phase electrical service to the Chlorination
33	Building located at the crossroads in Trout River; and
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1	WHEREAS the Customer has requested that the Applicant provide three-phase electrical
2	service which, in order to so provide, requires the upgrade of 1,093 metres of existing single-phase
3	distribution line to three-phase distribution line; and
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5	WHEREAS the Applicant has calculated a total CIAC for the Line Upgrade in accordance
6	with Clause 5(b) and (d) of the CIAC Policy: Distribution Line Extensions and Upgrades to General
7	Service Customers, approved by Order No. P.U. 7 (1997-98) dated September 30, 1997 (the
8	"Policy"), and the total CIAC thus calculated is \$50,027.09, HST included; and
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10	WHEREAS the total CIAC for the Line Upgrade is \$50,027.09 and Clause 11 (a) of the
11	Policy states that all Line Extensions or Upgrades involving CIACs where the construction costs are
12	estimated to be greater than \$25,000 must be submitted to the Board for approval; and
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14	WHEREAS the proposed expenditures on the Line Upgrade are necessary for the Applicant
15	to provide service and facilities to the Customer that are reasonably safe and adequate and just and
16	reasonable as required pursuant to section 37 of the Act; and
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18	WHEREAS the proposed CIAC is necessary to ensure that the Applicant's investment in
19	the Line Upgrade is compensatory over the useful life of the Line Upgrade and will not be to the
20	detriment of the Applicant's other customers.
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IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:

Pursuant to section 41(5) of the Act, the Board approves the contribution in aid	of
construction in the amount of fifty thousand, twenty-seven dollars and nine cents (\$50,027.0	9),
including HST, for the supply of three-phase electrical service to the Chlorination Building locat	ted
at the crossroads in Trout River, as calculated under the Policy.
