| 27 | Newfoundland Power provide their residences with single-phase electrical service and |

| 6 | WHEREAS the Policy provides that the minimum Participation Percentage necessary to |
| 37 | avail of the Non-Refundable CIAC Option is 50%, and to date, 38 of the 76 Customers have |
| 88 | accented service for a Participation Percentage of 50%; and |

WHEREAS a CIAC has been calculated in accordance with Clause 6(a) of the Policy, and the CIAC calculated is five thousand four hundred thirty-five dollars and eighty-five cents (\$5,435.85), excluding HST; and WHEREAS the sum of the CIAC calculated pursuant to Clause 6(a) and the Basic Investment calculated pursuant to Clause 3 is \$378,000.00 and Clause 10(i) of the Policy states that Newfoundland Power shall apply to the Board for approval of all CIACs where the sum of the CIAC calculated pursuant to Clause 5(a) or Clause 6(a) and the Basic and Additional Investment calculated pursuant to Clauses 3 and 4 is greater than \$50,000; and WHEREAS the proposed CIAC is necessary to ensure that Newfoundland Power's investment in the Extension is compensatory over the useful life of the Extension and will not be to the detriment of Newfoundland Power's other customers. **IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:** 1. The Board approves the Non-Refundable CIAC of five thousand four hundred thirty-five dollars and eighty-five cents (\$5,435.85), excluding HST, as calculated under the Policy to apply to Domestic Customers located in the Cottage Area known as Terra Nova Lake, pursuant to s. 41(5) of the *Act*. 2.
