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18	WHEREAS N	lewfoundland Power is a corporation duly organized and existing under the laws of		
19	the Province of	Newfoundland and Labrador, is a public utility within the meaning of the Act, and is		
20	also subject to	the provisions of the <i>EPCA</i> ; and		
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22	WHEREAS or	1 July 7, 2009 Newfoundland Power filed the Application with the Board for approval		
23	of an additiona	l amount of \$710,000 to be added to the Allowance for Unforeseen Items account;

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26	WHEREAS S	Section 41(3) of the Act states that a public utility shall not proceed with the		
27	construction, p	urchase or lease of improvements or additions to its property where:		
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29	(a)	the cost of the construction or purchase is in excess of \$50,000; or		
30	(b)	the cost of the lease is in excess of \$5,000 in a year of the lease,

34	WHEREAS N	ewfoundland Power's Kenmount Substation (the "Substation") is a 25 kV distribution		
35	substation loca	ted on Kenmount Road in the City of St. John's; and		

- WHEREAS the Substation's three distribution feeders serve approximately 5,300 customers
- 2 throughout a wide area including the residential neighborhoods in Cowan Heights, as well as some
- of the busiest commercial areas in the province, including O'Leary Industrial Park and the Kelsey
- 4 Drive shopping area; and
- 5 WHEREAS on March 26, 2009, a fault on a feeder lead to an internal fault on one of the
- 6 Substation's two 25 MWA transformers (the "Transformer"); and

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- 8 WHEREAS through subsequent inspections and engineering analysis, Newfoundland Power
- 9 determined that the Transformer needed to be remanufactured; and

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- 11 WHEREAS Newfoundland Power subsequently placed an order for the remanufacture of the
- 12 Transformer under the Allowance for Unforeseen Items account of \$750,000 approved by the Board
- in Order No. P. U. 27(2008) as part of Newfoundland Power's 2009 capital budget; and

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- 15 **WHEREAS** the estimated capital expenditure of \$710,000 associated with remanufacture of the
- 16 Transformer effectively depletes the balance in the Allowance for Unforeseen Items account; and

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- 18 **WHEREAS** the Capital Budget Guidelines issued by the Board in October 2007 permit a utility to
- apply for approval of an additional amount in the Allowance for Unforeseen Items account provided
- 20 the utility shows that usage of the account has been consistent with the Guidelines; and
- 21 WHEREAS the Board is satisfied that the use of the Allowance for Unforeseen Items by
- Newfoundland Power was in accordance with the Guidelines and that the proposed additional
- amount for this account should be approved.

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IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:

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1. Pursuant to Section 41(3) of the *Act* the Board approves an additional amount of \$710,000 to the Allowance for Unforeseen Items account approved in Order No. P. U. 27(2008).

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Newfoundland Power shall pay all the expenses of the Board arising from this Application.
