WHEREAS Newfoundland Power is a corporation duly organized and existing under the laws of
the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador, is a public utility within the meaning of the *Act*, and is
also subject to the provisions of the *EPCA*; and

WHEREAS on September 16, 2009 Newfoundland Power filed the Application with the Board for approval of an additional amount of \$375,000 to be added to the Allowance for Unforeseen Items account; and

WHEREAS Subsection 41(3) of the *Act* states that a public utility shall not proceed with the construction, purchase or lease of improvements or additions to its property where:

- 28 (a) the cost of the construction or purchase is in excess of \$50,000; or
  - (b) the cost of the lease is in excess of \$5,000 in a year of the lease,

31 without the prior approval of the Board; and

33 WHEREAS in Order No. P. U. 27(2008) issued November 12, 2008 the Board approved, *inter alia*,

- Newfoundland Power's 2009 Capital Budget of \$61,571,000, which included an Allowance for
- 35 Unforeseen Items Account in the amount of \$750,000; and

WHEREAS in Order No. P. U. 29(2009) the Board approved supplementary 2009 capital 1 expenditures in the amount of \$710,000 to the Allowance for Unforeseen Items account; and 2 3 WHEREAS Newfoundland Power's Seal Cove Plant (the "Plant") produces approximately 8.5 4 GWh of electricity on an annual basis, or approximately 2% of the total hydroelectric production of 5 Newfoundland Power: and 6 7 WHEREAS on March 17, 2009 a piece of concrete became lodged in the turbine wicket gates of the 8 9 Plant's Generating Unit No. 2 ("Unit No. 2"); and 10 WHEREAS this prevented the generator from shutting down properly and caused an overspeed 11 condition that damaged the turbine shaft and other essential components of Unit No. 2; and 12 13 14 WHEREAS through subsequent inspections and engineering analysis, Newfoundland Power determined that the turbine shaft and the stationary seal must be replaced, and other components of 15 the Plant's generating equipment must be refurbished; and 16 17 18 WHEREAS Newfoundland Power subsequently made arrangements for the rehabilitation of Unit No. 2 in accordance with the Allowance for Unforeseen Items approved by the Board in Order No. 19 P. U. 27(2008) as part of Newfoundland Power's 2009 Capital Budget; and 20 21 **WHEREAS** the estimated capital expenditure associated with returning Unit No. 2 to service is 22 \$375,000 which significantly reduced the balance in the Allowance for Unforeseen Items account; 23 24 and 25 WHEREAS the Capital Budget Application Guidelines issued by the Board in October 2007 26 27 permits a utility to apply for approval of an additional amount in the Allowance for Unforeseen Items account provided the utility shows that usage of the account has been consistent with the 28 Guidelines: and 29 30 WHEREAS the Board is satisfied that the use of the Allowance for Unforeseen Items by 31 Newfoundland Power was in accordance with the Guidelines and that the proposed additional 32 33 amount for this account should be approved. 34 35 **IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:** 36 The Board approves the proposed addition of a supplementary amount of \$375,000 to the 37 1. Allowance for Unforeseen Items Account approved in Order No. P. U. 27(2008). 38 39 40 2. Newfoundland Power shall pay all the expenses of the Board arising from this Application.
