23	WHEREAS on June 14, 2012 Newfoundland Power filed an application for approval of a
2425	Contribution in Aid of Construction ("CIAC") to provide three-phase electrical service to the Department of Transportation and Works, Government of Newfoundland and Labrador;

28	WHEREAS provision of the requested service will require Newfoundland Power to
29	upgrade 2,668 metres of existing two-phase line to three-phase standard and to construct an
30	additional 88 metres of three-phase line extension to serve a depot station in the Town of
31	Renews-Cappahayden; and

33	WHEREAS the CIAC, calculated in accordance with Clause 5(a) of the CIAC Policy, is
34	fifty thousand three hundred four dollars (\$50,304), excluding HST; and

WHEREAS the cost of the line extension calculated pursuant to Clause 5(a) exceeds \$50,000, and therefore in accordance with Clause 10(i) of the CIAC Policy Board approval is required; and

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WHEREAS the proposed CIAC is necessary to ensure that Newfoundland Power's investment is compensatory over the useful life of the extension and will not be to the detriment of Newfoundland Power's other customers.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:

1. The Contribution in Aid of Construction of fifty thousand three hundred four dollars (\$50,304), excluding HST, to provide a three-phase supply to the Department of Transportation and Works, Government of Newfoundland and Labrador is approved.

16 2. Newfoundland Power shall pay all expenses of the Board arising from this Application.
