WHEREAS the Policy provides that the minimum participation percentage necessary to avail of the Non-Refundable CIAC Option is 50% and, to date, 24 out of the 48 potential customers have accepted service, constituting a participation percentage of 50%; and

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WHEREAS the Non-Refundable CIAC, calculated in accordance with Clause 6 of the Policy, is thirteen thousand eight hundred fifty-eight dollars and seventy cents (\$13,858.70), excluding HST; and

WHEREAS the sum of the Non-Refundable CIAC calculated pursuant to Clause 6 and the Basic Investment calculated pursuant to Clause 3 exceeds \$50,000 and therefore, in accordance with Clause 10(i) of the Policy, Board approval is required; and

WHEREAS Hydro must also construct a 46kV substation to provide standard level distribution voltage; and

WHEREAS Hydro has applied for approval of the CIAC based on estimated constructions costs for a 46kV substation in addition to line extension costs, which is a deviation from the Policy; and

WHEREAS pursuant to Clause 10 (ii) of the Policy Hydro is required to apply to the Board for any deviation from the Policy; and

WHEREAS Hydro, pursuant to Section 41 (5) of the *Act*, requests that the Board approve a Non-Refundable CIAC of thirteen thousand eight hundred fifty-eight dollars and seventy cents (\$13,858.70), excluding HST, for each customer of the Duley Lake cottage area; and

WHEREAS Hydro, pursuant to Clause 10 (ii) of the Policy, requests that the Board approve a deviation from the Policy to allow the calculation of the Non-Refundable CIAC to be based on estimated constructions costs for a 46kV substation in addition to line extension costs; and

WHEREAS the proposed CIAC is necessary to ensure that Hydro's investment is compensatory over the useful life of the Extension and will not be to the detriment of Hydro's other customers.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:

1. The Non-Refundable Contribution in Aid of Construction of thirteen thousand eight hundred fifty-eight dollars and seventy cents (\$13,858.70), excluding HST, to apply to Domestic Customers located in the cottage area known as Duley Lake is approved.

41 2. A deviation from the Policy requirement respecting the calculation of the Contribution in Aid of Construction is approved.

3. Hydro shall pay all expenses of the Board arising from this Application.
