AN ORDER OF THE BOARD

1 **IN THE MATTER OF** the *Electrical Power*
2 *Control Act, 1994*, SNL 1994, Chapter E-5.1
3 (the “*EPCA*”) and the *Public Utilities Act*, RSNL
4 1990, Chapter P-47 (the “*Act*”), as amended,
5 and regulations thereunder; and

7 **IN THE MATTER OF** an application
8 by Newfoundland Power Inc. for approval
9 of a Contribution in Aid of Construction for
10 three-phase service for 10718 Nfld. Inc.,
11 pursuant to section 41 of the *Act*.

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14 **WHEREAS** Newfoundland Power Inc. (“Newfoundland Power”) is a corporation duly
15 organized and existing under the laws of the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador, is a public
16 utility within the meaning of the *Act*, and is also subject to the provisions of the *EPCA*; and

18 **WHEREAS** 10718 Nfld. Inc. (the “Customer”) operates a lift station located on Reservoir Road
19 in the City of St. John’s, and has requested that Newfoundland Power provide this facility with
20 three-phase electrical service; and

22 **WHEREAS** on June 23, 2016 Newfoundland Power filed an application for approval of a
23 Contribution in Aid of Construction (“CIAC”) to upgrade 172 metres of single-phase line to
24 three-phase standard and to construct a further 1,048 metre of three-phase extension (the
25 “Extension”) to provide service to the Customer’s facility; and

27 **WHEREAS** the CIAC, calculated in accordance with Clause 5(a) of CIAC Policy: Distribution
28 Line Extensions and Upgrades to General Service Customers, approved by Order No. P.U.
29 27(2005), (the “Policy”), is sixty-two thousand five hundred sixty-one dollars (\$62,561.00),
30 excluding HST; and

32 **WHEREAS** Clause 10(i) of the Policy states that all Line extensions or Upgrades involving
33 CIACs where the costs of the Line extension or Upgrade calculated pursuant to Clause 5(a) are
34 estimated to be greater than \$50,00; and
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36 **WHEREAS** the proposed CIAC is necessary to ensure that Newfoundland Power’s investment
37 in the Extension is compensatory over the useful life of the Extension and will not be to the
38 detriment of its other customers.

1 **IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:**


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1. The Contribution in Aid of Construction of sixty-two thousand five hundred sixty-one dollars (\$62,561.00), excluding HST, to provide three-phase service to 10718 Nfld. Inc. is approved.
2. Newfoundland Power shall pay all expenses of the Board arising from this Application.


