1	IN THE MATTER OF the Electrical Power
2	Control Act, 1994, SNL 1994, Chapter E-5.1 (the
3	"EPCA") and the Public Utilities Act, RSNL
4	1990, Chapter P-47 (the "Act"), as amended,
5	and regulations thereunder; and

7	IN THE MATTER OF an application by
8	Newfoundland Power Inc. for approval of a
9	Contribution in Aid of Construction for a
10	single-phase extension to Harmon Seaside Park
11	Developments Limited, pursuant to section 41
12	of the Act.

15	WHEREAS Newfoundland Power Inc. ("Newfoundland Power") is a corporation duly organized
16	and existing under the laws of the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador, is a public utility
17	within the meaning of the Act, and is also subject to the provisions of the EPCA; and
18	
19	WHEREAS on April 16, 2018 Newfoundland Power filed an application for approval of a
20	Contribution in Aid of Construction ("CIAC") for a single-phase extension of approximately 1,968
21	metres (the "Extension") to serve a recreational vehicle park owned by Harmon Seaside Park
22	Developments Limited and located on Massachusetts Drive in the town of Stephenville; and
23	
24	WHEREAS the CIAC, calculated in accordance with Clause 5(a) of the CIAC Policy: Distribution
25	Line Extensions and Upgrades to General Service Customers approved by Order No. P.U.
26	27(2005) (the "Policy"), is seventy thousand and seventy one dollars (\$70,071.00), excluding
27	HST; and
28	
29	WHEREAS Clause 10(i) of the Policy states all line extensions or upgrades involving CIACs
30	where the costs calculated pursuant to Clause 5(a) are estimated to be greater than \$50,000 require
31	approval of the Board; and
32	THE DEAG (1 LOTAC'
33	WHEREAS the proposed CIAC is necessary to ensure that Newfoundland Power's investment in
34	the Extension is compensatory over the useful life of the Extension and will not be to the detriment
35	of its other customers.

## **IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:**

1. The Contribution in Aid of Construction of seventy thousand and seventy one dollars (\$70,071.00), excluding HST, to provide a single-phase supply to a recreational vehicle park development for Harmon Seaside Park Developments Limited located on Massachusetts Drive in the town of Stephenville is approved.

2. Newfoundland Power Inc. shall pay all expenses of the Board arising from this Application.
