AN ORDER OF THE BOARD

NO. P.U. 3(2024)

1 **IN THE MATTER OF** the **Electrical Power**
2 **Control Act, 1994**, SNL 1994, Chapter E-5.1
3 (the “**EPCA**”) and the **Public Utilities Act**,
4 RSNL 1990, Chapter P-47 (the “**Act**”), as
5 amended, and regulations thereunder; and

7 **IN THE MATTER OF** an application by
8 Newfoundland Power Inc. for approval of
9 a Contribution in Aid of Construction to provide
10 single-phase electrical service for roadway
11 lighting in the City of St. John's, pursuant to
12 section 41 of the **Act**.

15 **WHEREAS** Newfoundland Power Inc. (“Newfoundland Power”) is a corporation duly organized
16 and existing under the laws of the Province of Newfoundland and Labrador, is a public utility
17 within the meaning of the **Act**, and is also subject to the provisions of the **EPCA**; and

19 **WHEREAS** on January 16, 2024 Newfoundland Power filed an application for approval of a
20 Contribution in Aid of Construction (“CIAC”) for a single-phase extension of 1,933 metres to
21 provide electrical service for roadway lighting along Pitts Memorial Drive in the City of St. John’s,
22 owned and maintained by the Government of Newfoundland and Labrador; and

24 **WHEREAS** the estimated cost of construction, based on the applicable cost per metre estimate
25 in accordance with section 5(a) of the CIAC Policy: Distribution Line Extensions and Upgrades to
26 General Service Customers approved by Order No. P.U. 27(2005) (the “Policy”), is \$98,042; and

28 **WHEREAS** Clause 10(i) of the Policy requires Newfoundland Power to apply to the Board for
29 approval of all line extensions or upgrades involving CIACs where the costs calculated pursuant
30 to Clause 5(a) are estimated to be greater than \$50,000; and

32 **WHEREAS** the CIAC, also calculated in accordance with the Policy, is ninety-three thousand eight
33 hundred and seventy-seven dollars (\$93,877.00), excluding HST; and

35 **WHEREAS** the proposed CIAC is necessary to ensure Newfoundland Power’s investment is
36 compensatory over the useful life of the extension and will not be to the detriment of its other
37 customers.

1 **IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:**


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3 1. The Contribution in Aid of Construction of ninety-three thousand eight hundred and seventy-
4 seven dollars (\$93,877.00), excluding HST, for a line extension to provide electrical service for
5 roadway lighting along Pitts Memorial Drive in the City of St. John's is approved.


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7 2. Newfoundland Power shall pay all expenses of the Board arising from this Application.
