TAKE NOTICE that Abitibi-Consolidated Company of Canada ("ACCC"), through its solicitor Colm St. Roch Seviour of Stewart McKelvey, hereby gives notice of its intention to intervene in the within Application, in its position as a former Industrial Customer of the Applicant Newfoundland and Labrador Hydro (the "Applicant").

Interest of the Industrial Customers

1. ACCC formerly owned and operated substantial pulp and paper enterprises on the Island of Newfoundland, each of which was a major consumer of power purchased from the Applicant, and ACCC purchased power from the Applicant at the interim Industrial Customer rate until early 2009.

Disposition Sought by ACCC

2. Given the present significance to ACCC of the matter of the potential treatment of the Rate Stabilization Plan components of the rates charged to the Industrial Customers which are raised by the Application, ACCC will require the reasonable opportunity to consider information obtained by Requests for Information, and possibly by other pre-

hearing and hearing processes, before advocating specific dispositions in respect of the Application.

Facts and Reasons Supporting Intervention

3. The Application, *inter alia*, raises certain issues in respect of the Rate Stabilization Plan components of the rates charged to Industrial Customers, which issues have significant implications for ACCC as a former Industrial Customer which has paid substantial rates to the Applicant and thereby contributed to the amounts presently in credit under the Rate Stabilization Plan.

Participation of ACCC

- 4. ACCC intends to participate in the various procedures associated with the Application, including without limitation:
 - (a) directing Requests for Information and other information requests to the Applicant as may be permitted by the Board;
 - (b) participating in any technical conferences, pre-hearing conferences, and other processes which may be associated with the Application;
 - (c) if a hearing is necessary, the cross-examination of witnesses appearing on behalf of the Applicant or of any other participant in any hearing on the Application, and the of calling witnesses, including expert witnesses; and
 - (d) making representations and submissions, through counsel, to the Board concerning the disposition of the Application.
