1	Q.	Please provide a detailed scope of the pole count survey setting out the information
2		which will be gathered from the completed survey.
3		
4	A.	The 2001 JUFPA made provision for a pole count survey to confirm the number of Joint
5		Use Support Structures, upon its renewal or termination in 2010. Such a provision was
6		reasonable given the inherent imprecision associated with tracking Joint Use Support
7		Structures and attachments to them. The pole count survey will not alter any of the
8		fundamental cost sharing and operational arrangements agreed between Newfoundland
9		Power and Bell Aliant.
0		
1		The proposed sale contemplates a division of the Joint Use Support Structures between
2		Newfoundland Power and Bell Aliant based on certain identified characteristics in order
3		to achieve an equitable split of the Joint Use Support Structures. These characteristics
14 15		include physical characteristics, geographic location and attachments. The pole count
16		survey will confirm the field information required for determination of the specific Support Structures to be transferred to Bell Aliant.

8		The pole count survey will include all Support Structures. An independent contractor
9		will carry out the survey using handheld electronic devices to confirm specific
