Q. What is the current status of the discussions with Bell Aliant regarding the future operational and financial aspects of this transaction beyond 2011, referenced at page 41 of Newfoundland Power's 2010 Annual Report? Please detail the nature of these discussions.

A. A. Background

 Throughout the extended negotiations through the last half of 2010, Newfoundland Power and Bell Aliant negotiated and agreed upon a new joint use regime to replace the Joint Use Facilities Partnership Agreement ("JUFPA") in effect from 2001 to 2010. The new Joint Use Agreement ("2011 JUA") is effective as of January 1, 2011. As part of the negotiations, the parties discussed and agreed upon the construction and maintenance responsibilities of each party for 2011 and 2012. Arrangements beyond 2013 are currently being discussed. Sections B and C below summarize what has been discussed and agreed upon by the parties, subject to the completion of the proposed pole sale.

B. Support Structure Installations and Removals

For 2011 and 2012 Newfoundland Power will be responsible to install and remove all Joint Use Support Structures as required by both parties pursuant to the 2011 JUA. This work will be completed under the existing contracts between Newfoundland Power and its pole contractors.

This construction work will be performed in accordance with the Construction Standards as outlined in the 2011 JUA.

Arrangements for Joint Use Support Structure installations and removals for 2013 and beyond are currently being discussed. One possible arrangement that is under discussion is a joint pole contract. Under such an arrangement the pole contractor would do work for both Newfoundland Power and Bell Aliant. Such an arrangement existed in the 1990s.

C. Maintenance Work

For 2011, Newfoundland Power has agreed to perform all planned maintenance work¹ and maintenance work of an emergency nature² associated with all Joint Use Support Structures as part of the transition to the new Joint Use regime.

Planned maintenance work will include the inspections of Support Structures, prompt correction of defects identified during inspections, vegetation management and response to customer requests on an ongoing basis.

Maintenance work of an emergency nature will include standby service and trouble call response including such things as repairing broken guy wires, securing damaged Poles etc. Standby service will consist of island wide 24 hour/ 7 day customer contact availability and field response as per Section 20 of the Administrative Practices in the 2011 JUA.

1	In 2012, each party will be responsible to perform all aspects of operating and
2	maintaining their Joint Use Support Structures. Maintenance work will be completed in
3	accordance with the Maintenance Standards as outlined in the 2011 JUA. ³
4	
5	Settlement of the details of the performance of maintenance in 2012 and beyond could
6	involve co-operative arrangements between the parties which might reduce
7	Newfoundland Power's costs and thereby increase the benefits to Newfoundland Power
8	and its customers of the new Joint Use regime. Any such potential benefits are not
9	reflected in the analysis currently before the Board. ⁴

Bell Aliant will, by June 30, 2011, indicate its detailed plans to Newfoundland Power for completing maintenance for 2012 and beyond in accordance with the 2011 JUA.
