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Q. 1 How did the revised docking procedure described at pp. 4-5 of Hydro's report differ 2 from the procedure that was previously in place? 3 4 5 A. Tankers would berth under pilot supervision and calm weather conditions port side 6 without tug assistance. Tug assistance of bow-thrusted vessels provide greater maneuverability since vessels lose rudder control at berthing speeds. The use of 7 8 tugs permits vessels to berth starboard side so the bow is facing out the bay; this 9 position provides the safest and quickest departure route during an emergency.
