14	Α.	On June 29, 2021, it was announced that "the Government of Canada is setting a mandatory
15		target for all new light-duty cars and passenger trucks sales to be zero-emission by 2035,
16		accelerating Canada's previous goal of 100 percent sales by 2040." ¹ To Newfoundland and
17		Labrador Hydro's knowledge, the Government of Canada has not yet instituted any regulatory
18		measures with respect to this target. The announcement modifies previous sales targets in years
19		that are beyond the five-year period of the current Electrification, Conservation and Demand
20		Management ("ECDM") Plan 2021–2025. At the time the next five-year ECDM plan is filed, it is
21		expected that there will be greater certainty as to how the recent announcement will impact
22		electric vehicles sales, along with all other aspects of forecast energy sales and cost testing
23		surrounding the ECDM strategy.
