Does Hydro agree with this statement? Please explain. 5 6 7 The examination of the current capital budget approval process and the recommendations for 8 A. 9 amendment to same are being examined by the Board of Commissioners of Public Utilities and 10 the parties as part of a separate proceeding. Newfoundland and Labrador Hydro feels it is premature to address Midgard Consulting Incorporated's report while the proceeding to which 11 12 it relates is ongoing.
