(a) Please advise if Hydro plans to continue to increase the rates of its rural isolated customers (customers not on the Island Interconnected system) whose rates are based on Newfoundland Power rates as the collection of Muskrat Falls costs are included and increased in Newfoundland Power utility's rate, in the absence of further direction from government.

(b) If (a) is confirmed, has Hydro explained to these customers that even though the Muskrat Falls costs will only be collected from the Island Interconnected customers, Hydro's rural isolated customer rates will also increase as Newfoundland Power's customer's rates increase to recover Muskrat Falls costs, but will be used to reduce the rural deficit? If so, please provide this communication.

A. (a) Absent any change in government direction, Newfoundland and Labrador Hydro ("Hydro") will continue to comply with Order in Council OC2003-347 and apply Section 16 of Hydro's Rates, Rules and Regulations, *Policies for Automatic Rate Changes* in its applications for rate changes for its rural customers.

(b) Hydro has provided information on its website with respect to rates for its rural customers, as well as communication to them in the form of a bill insert which is attached as PUB-NLH-002, Attachment 1. However, the communication does not discuss, in depth, the mechanics and impacts of Order in Council OC2003-347, and Section 16 of Hydro's Rates, Rules and Regulations, *Policies for Automatic Rate Changes* as it relates to Island Interconnected customer rates and the recovery of Muskrat Falls project costs.

#### ELECTRICITY RATES REMAIN STABLE, DECREASES IN MOST RATE CATEGORIES, EFFECTIVE July 1, 2022

Rates for Newfoundland and Labrador Hydro's (Hydro) Island Interconnected, L'Anse au Loup and Isolated Rural customer rates will remain stable, with most rates decreasing between 0.1% and 0.3%, effective July 1, 2022.

There is no change to rates for Labrador Interconnected customers.

#### Why are rates decreasing?

As Newfoundland Power's rates are changing as of July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2022, Hydro is required to automatically adjust rates for some customers so they pay the same rates as Newfoundland Power customers or their existing rates are adjusted by the average rate of change granted Newfoundland Power.

Rates are implemented in accordance with Section 16 of Hydro's Rules and Regulations, Policies for Automatic Rate Changes.
