 Q. (Reference CA-NP-031) It is stated "The topic of integrated resource planning is ongoing as part of Newfoundland and Labrador Hydro's Reliability and Resource Adequacy Study review, of which Newfoundland Power is a participant." Does Newfoundland Power perform integrated resource planning for its distribution system?

No, Newfoundland Power does not perform integrated resource planning specific to its distribution system. Integrated resource planning is a consultative process where utilities work with other utility partners, stakeholders, and the regulator to plan for the long-term future of the electricity system. The Board has previously concluded that:

"Integrated Resources Planning is a complex regulatory issue which should be considered in the context of a generic process involving both utilities and other interested parties." 1

As stated in the response to Request for Information CA-NP-031, the topic of integrated resource planning is ongoing as part of Hydro's *Reliability and Resource Adequacy Study* review, of which Newfoundland Power is a participant.

Newfoundland Power's distribution planning and capital planning processes include the application of technical criteria, economic analyses and assessments of alternatives. These processes are used to complete a fulsome review of all viable options necessary to provide safe, reliable and least cost electrical service to customers.
