WHEREAS the Board is satisfied that the operations of the Certificate vest in the corporation and that the shares of the corporation may only be held by members of the co-operative and that no dividends or profit are to be paid to any member or shareholder of the co-operative, and

WHEREAS the Board is of the opinion that the reissuance of Motor Carrier Certificate No. 4026, in the name North Shore Central Ambulance Co-operative Limited, is in the public interest.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT:
